- “By 2014, electroluminescent panels will be in common use. Ceilings and walls will glow softly, and in a variety of colors that will change at the touch of a push button.”
- “Gadgetry will continue to relieve mankind of tedious jobs. Kitchen units will be devised that will prepare "automeals," heating water and converting it to coffee; toasting bread; frying, poaching or scrambling eggs, grilling bacon, and so on.”
- “Robots will neither be common nor very good in 2014, but they will be in existence. General Electric at the 2014 World's Fair will be showing 3-D movies of its "Robot of the Future," neat and streamlined, its cleaning appliances built in and performing all tasks briskly.”
- “The appliances of 2014 will have no electric cords, of course, for they will be powered by long-lived batteries running on radioisotopes.”
- “Much effort will be put into the designing of vehicles with "Robot-brains" - vehicles that can be set for particular destinations and that will then proceed there without interference by the slow reflexes of a human driver.”
- “Communications will become sight-sound and you will see as well as hear the person you telephone. The screen can be used not only to see the people you call but also for studying documents and photographs and reading passages from books.”

Revolutions and Evolution

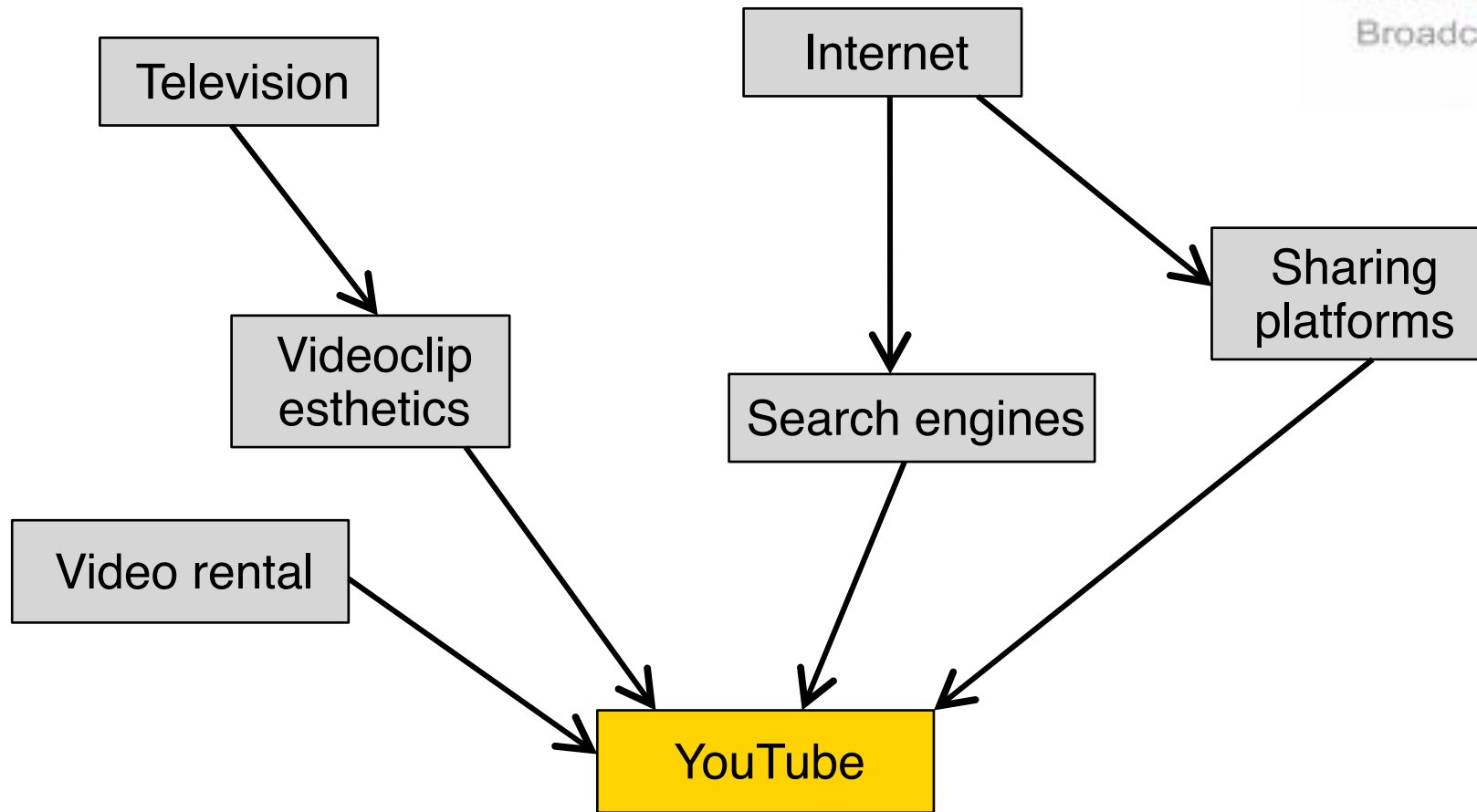
- Technological revolutions:
 - Roots in different areas of science (e.g. Laser, Public/Private-Key)
- Transfer revolutions:
 - Known techniques applied in new domain (e.g. Bezier curves)
- Recombination revolutions:
 - New combination of known techniques (e.g. Smartphones)
- *Appropriation* of new technologies does not follow revolutionary scheme but proceeds in evolutionary way:
 - Slow social processes
 - Adaptation of behavioral patterns
 - Learning processes
 - Reputation building

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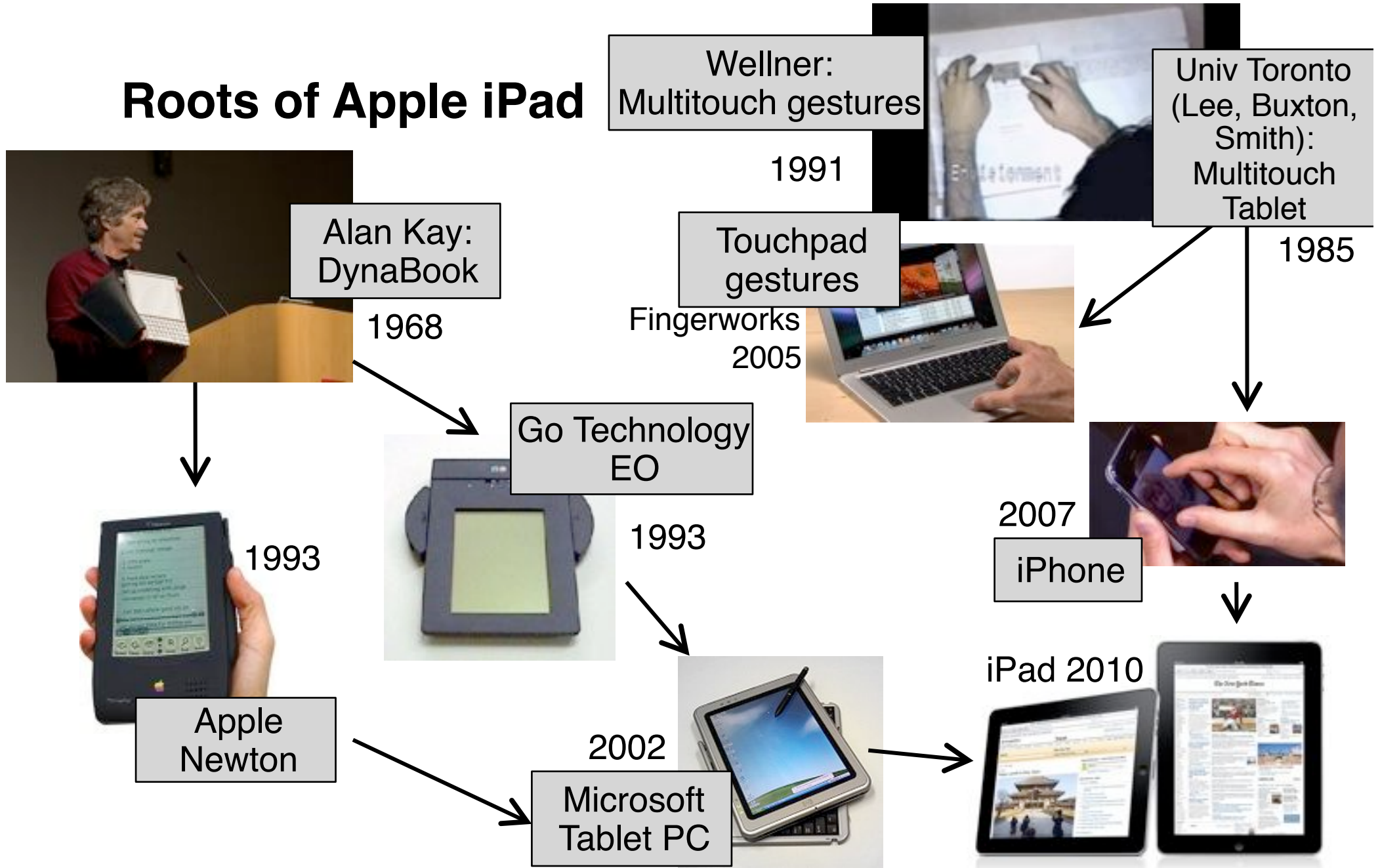

Roots of Apple iPad

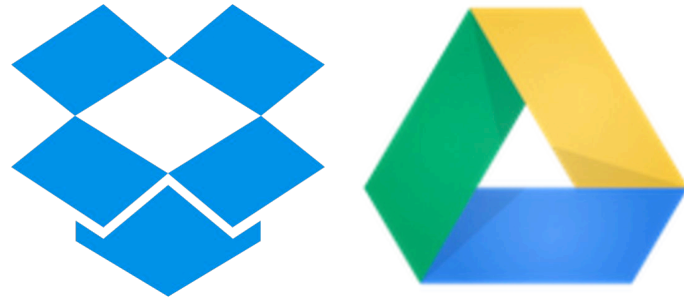

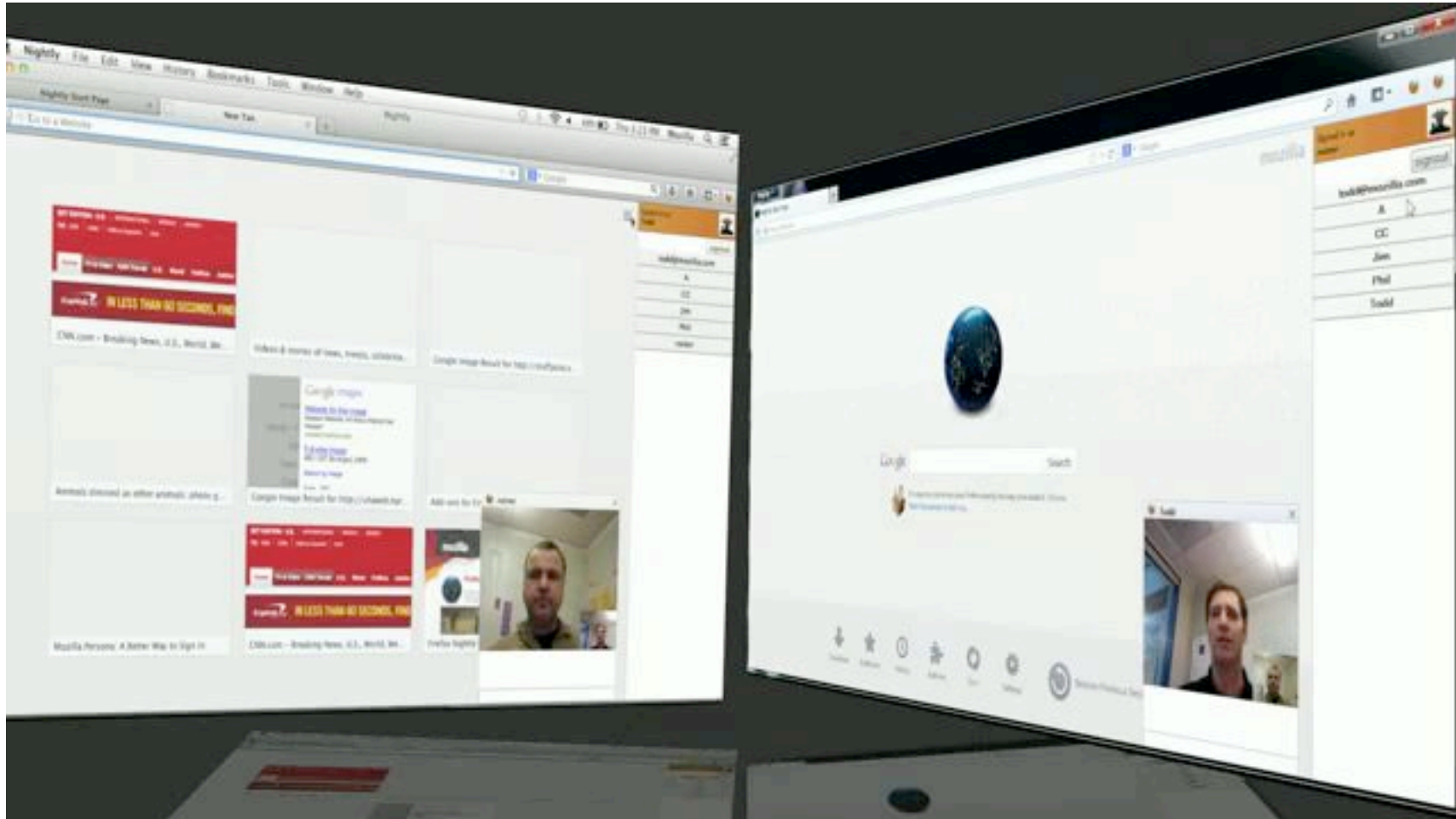

Samsung cuts target notebook shipments to 7 million units for 2014

Samsung Electronics has set a goal of shipping seven million notebooks globally in 2014, a reduction of 41.67% from the 12 million units shipped in 2013, and will no longer launch conventional notebook models **except Chromebooks** in 2015, according to Taiwan-based supply chain makers.

WebRTC: Technological Remarks

- WebRTC is completely based on JavaScript APIs
 - JavaScript Session Establishment Protocol (JSEP)
 - Allows to control call signaling protocols like SIP or Jingle
 - Media capabilities communicated through SDP
- Internet Connectivity Establishment Framework (ICE), IETF
 - Facilitates connectivity of hosts in presence of firewalls and NAT
 - Session Traversal Utilities for NAT (STUN)
 - » Assigns public address to clients behind NAT
 - Traversal Using Relays around NAT (TURN)
 - » Relays media through public server
- Multipoint Control Unit (MCU) for WebRTC
 - Can use traditional hardware (e.g. from Cisco)
 - Open source MCU software (e.g. OpenTok Mantis)

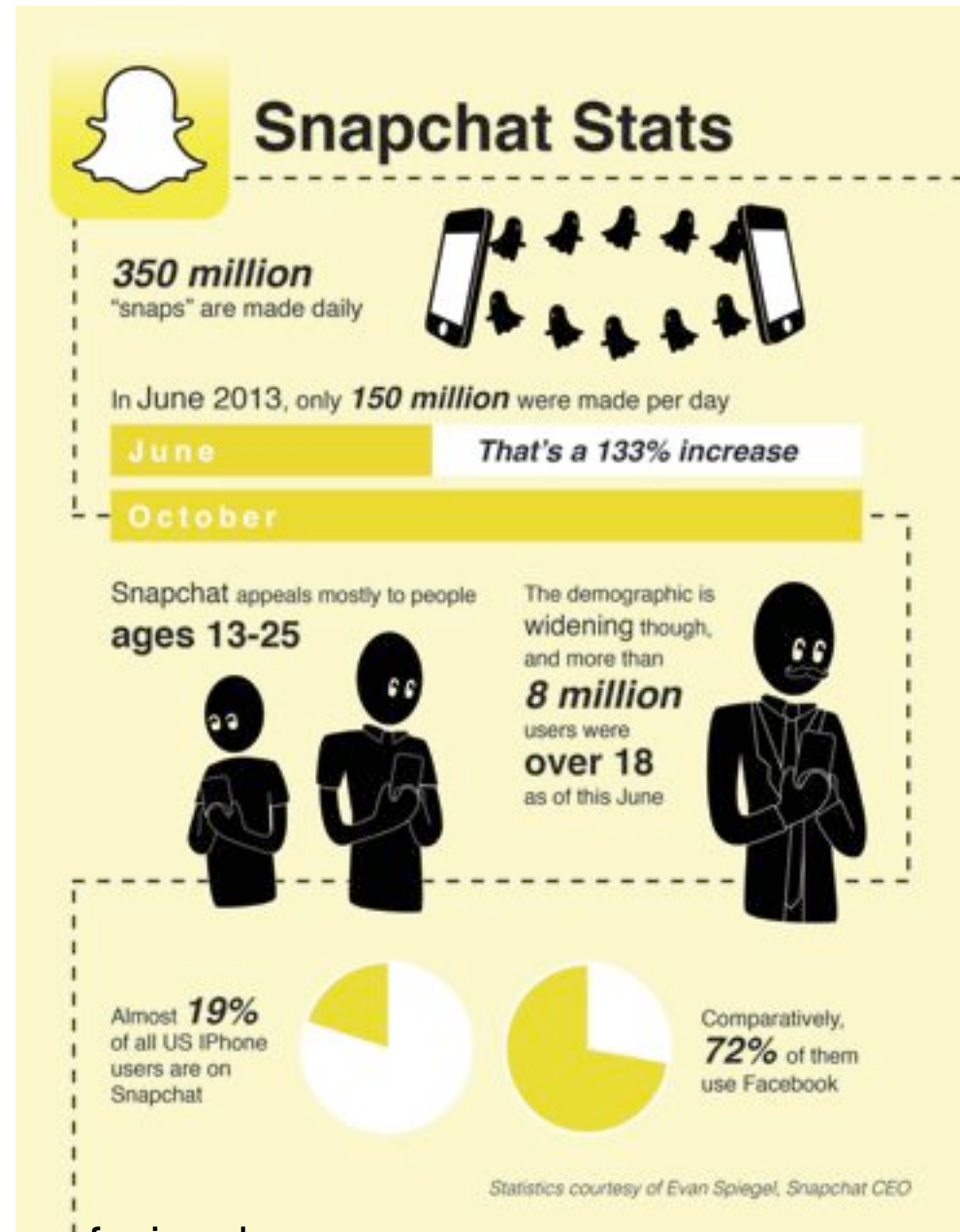

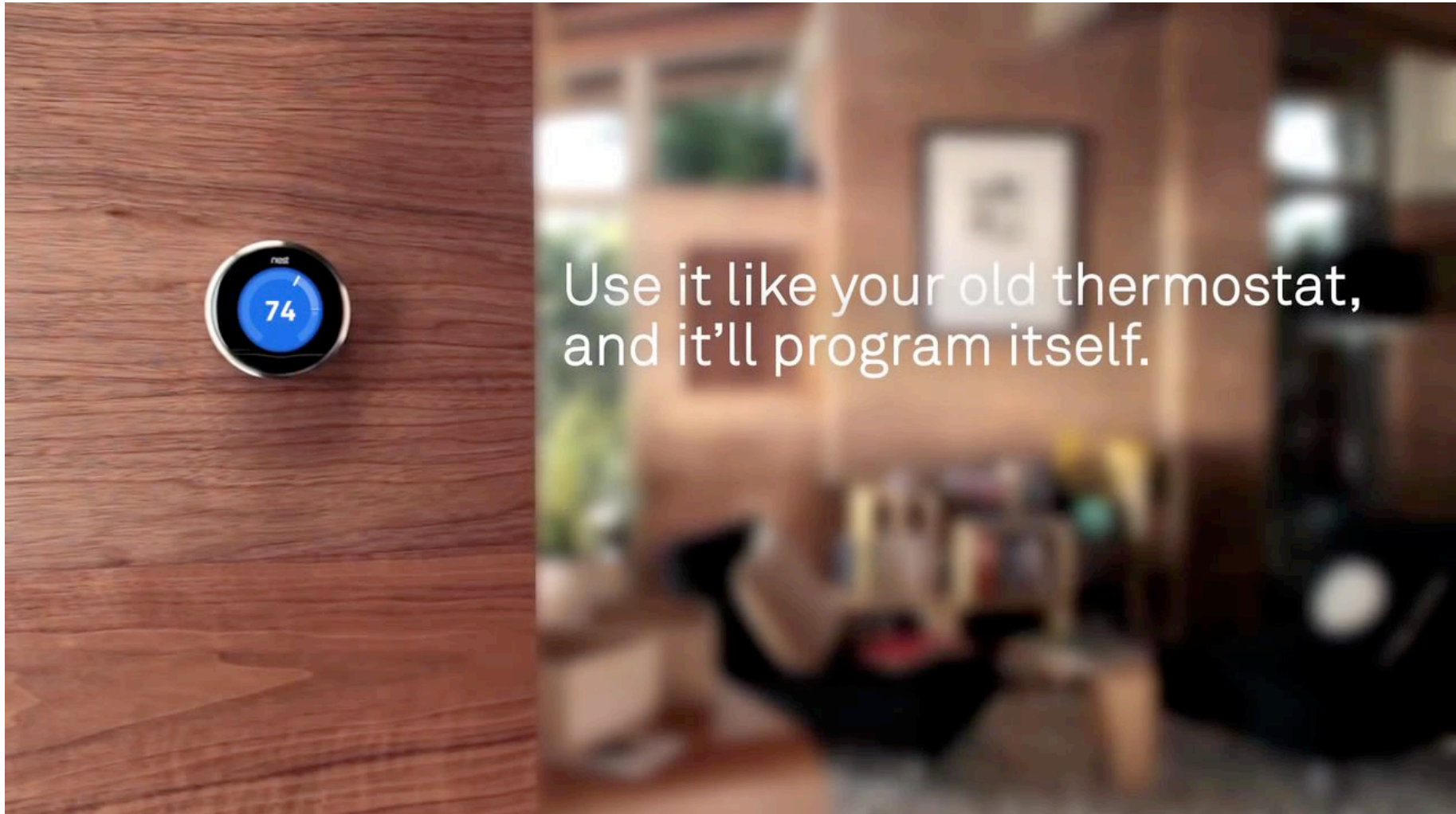
Media Messages with Expiry Time

 - \$ 3.2 bio in cash



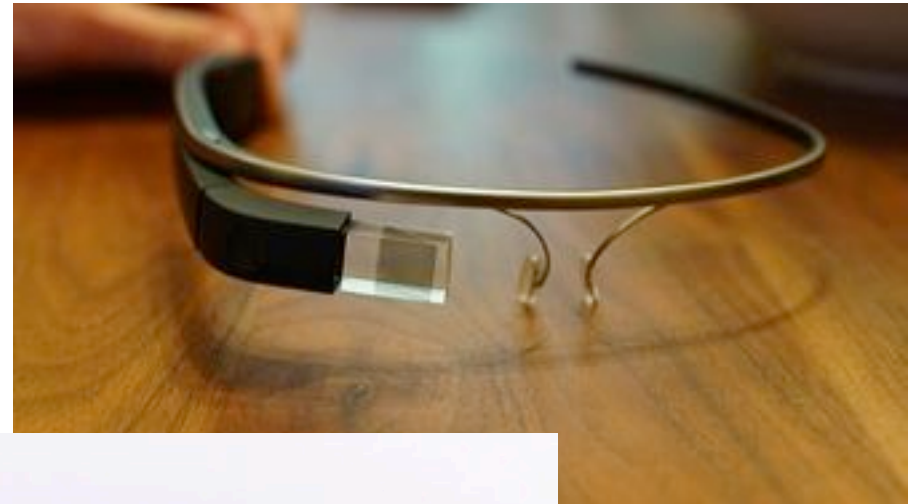
